Prof. Dr. Oğuz Tekin is a faculty member at Koç University, Department of Archaeology and History of Art, as well as the Director of the Suna & İnan Kıraç Research Center for Mediterranean Civilizations at the same university. Tekin specializes in numismatics and commercial weights, and he is also the editor of the *Sylloge Nummorum Graecorum Türkiye and Corpus Ponderum Antiquorum et Islamicorum* projects. His publications, which focus on public museums and private collections in Türkiye, are part of these two international projects. His areas of interest and study are the history of Anatolian coinage, numismatics, commercial balance weights and markets from the Archaic Period to the end of the Byzantine Empire.

Yavuz Selim Güler serves as the Suna and İnan Kıraç Foundation Pera Museum's Anatolian Weights and Measures Collection Supervisor and Kütahya Tile and Ceramics Collection Supervisor. Güler is the supervisor of the "Corpus Ponderum Antiquorum et Islamicorum: Ottoman Weights" and "Epigraphy of Weights" projects at the Pera Museum. His areas of interest and study are Anatolian Weights and Measures from the Bronze Age to the Ottoman Period and the 18-20th Century Kütahya Tiles and Ceramics.
