**Instructors**

**Assoc. Prof. Hüseyin Sami Öztürk (Marmara University)**

Hüseyin Sami Öztürk studied archeology at Istanbul University. He received his master's degree from Marmara University, Department of Ancient History in 1999 with his dissertation titled "Honoring in the Hellenistic Age", and completed his Ph.D. in the same university with his dissertation titled "Rural Area Security in the Lycia-Pamphylia Region in the 2nd Century BC - 4th Century AD" in 2006. In 2018, he became an Associate Professor at the Department of Ancient History at Marmara University and continues to serve as a lecturer at the same university.

Dr. Öztürk has been working as an epigraphist in surface surveys in Lycia for many years, and he also leads an epigraphic surface survey of Bithynia in the provinces of Sakarya and Bilecik. Serving as an epigraphist for the Olympos and Adramyttium excavations, Öztürk also actively works at several museums.

**Yavuz Selim Güler (Pera Museum)**

Yavuz Selim Güler studied Archeology and Art History at Koç University. Between the years 2018 and 2020, he served as an assistant for the Ancient Greek and Latin language as well as Ancient History courses. In 2020, he completed his master's thesis on "Roman Merchants and Bankers in the Province of Asia". After working in the field of museum education for a while, he has been serving as Suna and İnan Kıraç Foundation Pera Museum's Anatolian Weights and Measures Collection Supervisor since 2021.

**Application Requirements**

The program is open to undergraduate and graduate students studying in the archeology, art history and ancient history programs. Other applications will be evaluated by the program supervisors. Participants are expected to have completed an introductory level Ancient Greek course.
