### **Half Term Holiday Activities 2014**

#### **05 February - 09 February 2014**

Pera Learning organized a variety of creative workshops inspired by the Suna and İnan Kiraç Foundation collection exhibitions for the 4-6 and 7-14 age groups to enjoy in the Museum during their half-term.

#### **Pera Kids**

##### **Age 4-6**

##### **Familiar and Unfamiliar Animals**

This workshop gave the opportunity for the children to study the animals that appear in the orientalist paintings of the Suna and İnan Kiraç Foundation Collection, with particular attention to Osman Hamdi Bey's Tortoise Trainer painting. After exploring the paintings, children created new species of animals with scrap materials and fabrics.

##### **Ambassadors and Me!**

After exploring and examining the paintings in the Intersecting Worlds: Ambassadors and Painters exhibition the children created their own collages and frames.

##### **Mini Me**

After visiting the Suna and İnan Kiraç Foundation Collection of Anatolian Weights and Measures, children measured out their height and weight in coloured dough and created their own small-sized, three-dimensional version of themselves.

##### **Clothes, Finery, Accessories**

Suna and İnan Kiraç Foundation Orientalist Painting Collection "Intersecting Worlds: Ambassadors and Painters" exhibition depicted the Ottoman world and provided the opportunity to examine the outfits of the time. How fashions have changed, how people dressed daily and how they were allowed to dress. After exploring these ideas, the children designed their own accessories.

##### **Shapes on My Plate**

After exploring and examining the Kütahya Tiles and Ceramics exhibition, children had the opportunity to design their own motifs and patterns.

##### **Let's Experiment: Soap Lab**

After exploring and examining the section that relates to pharmacy in the Suna and İnan Kiraç Foundation Collection of Anatolian Weights and Measures, children created their own soaps.
